

Offers to students and staff the opportunity to study or train abroad

Mobility is the essential tool to build **an effective European lifelong learning space**, to foster employment, reduce poverty and contribute to promoting active European citizenship.

In the programming 2021-2027, Erasmus+ aims at reaching these goals through **4 priorities: digital transformation, social inclusion, environmental sustainability, active and social participation.**

## Students – opportunities not to be missed

With Erasmus+, **students and new graduates** improve their learning performances, language competences, employability, and career prospects, learn the value of teamwork and foster their autonomy and self-entrepreneurship. Moreover, Erasmus+ is a unique opportunity to create an extraordinary social and professional network, to boost self-esteem, active participation in society and the European citizenship feeling.

### If you are a student of the first, second or third cycle, with Erasmus you can:



Leave for **study or traineeship mobility in Europe and in the world!** You have 12 months of Erasmus+ mobility for each study cycle, from the first year of enrolment and, in case of a traineeship, up to one year after obtaining the qualification, provided that you are the winner of an Erasmus+ scholarship during the last year of the training course undertaken.



Participate in **Erasmus Mundus joint courses** if your university has activated them. The Mundus are second cycle courses of excellence organized by consortia of universities of at least 3 European countries, with mandatory mobility and a final qualification recognized in all countries participating in the network.



Ask to take part in **blended mobility**, that is a short-term period of physical mobility, from 5 to 30 days, mandatorily integrated with a virtual mobility period. This obligation does not apply to **PhD students**.



Join a **European university**, a key action for strategic transnational cooperation which guarantees high quality levels in education, research, and innovation.

## Teachers, staff, and company personnel

Erasmus+ mobility offers to higher education staff the opportunity to participate in activities to teach and to update their own skills in Europe and in the world. Depending on the action you take part in, this can last from 2 to 5 days, up to a maximum of 2 months. Erasmus+ mobility allows you to acquire new professional skills and deal with new teaching methods.

**Personnel coming from companies**, of any Country, is invited for teaching or training activities at a higher educational institution to transfer skills and know-how to staff and students, improve cooperation with higher educational institutions and contribute to the development of innovative programmes and methods.

## BIP: a step ahead for learning and teaching

**Blended Intensive Programmes** are a further opportunity addressed to both students and academic staff. BIPs support innovative teaching and learning methods.

These are intensive blended programmes, developed by groups of higher education institutions with a new pedagogical approach. They involve short periods of face-to-face activity combined with online learning and cooperation activities, in order to extend participation opportunities as much as possible.

## Do you know that...

- ☆ Now you can do everything with the **Erasmus App!!!** From Learning agreement to host city info: your Erasmus is just a click away, download it now!!
- ☆ Remember to activate your **European Student Card**, the student's digital passport which streamlines procedures and gives access to many useful services.
- ☆ In the Erasmus Student Charter, you will find listed your rights and duties during mobility.
- ☆ Based on the ISEE (Equivalent Economic Situation Indicator) you can have an economic top up for your international mobility period.
- ☆ In case of specific needs - physical, mental, health, cultural or geographical - there is an economic chapter just for you!
- ☆ If you reach your Erasmus destination with a green travel, you have additional financial support.
